












GALESS / BGN Conference in Melbourne October 2024



Graduation Fabris Mulindi – GALESS Strategy Taskforce



The GALESS community is excited to share incredible news with you. Our current nominated Ambassador on the African continent, Fabris Mulindi, has just graduated from the prestigious African Leadership Academy. Fabris participated in the GALESS conference in 2023 in Poland, where he and his team made an outstanding impression by presenting on renewable energy in Morocco. Fabris is described by his school as a well-rounded individual with a deep passion for sustainability and remarkable talents.



In his first year at the Academy, Fabris won the All-Rounded Student Award, followed by the Climate Change Leadership Award. In his second year, he was honored with the Best Social

Entrepreneur of the Year award. Most recently, in 2024, Fabris graduated with the Sani Award, which is given to the students who are believed to have the most innovative ideas to transform

the African continent.

Fabris's contributions extend beyond his school duties. He was recognized as the winner of the Mitsubishi Challenges in 2024 for his groundbreaking idea of capturing carbon using irrigation water. Additionally, he has actively participated in the Water Challenge with Operation Water where he ideated how to clean water using



the sun and performed at the opening ceremony of COP28 in Dubai.

Growing up as a refugee, Fabris has exceeded all expectations and defied stereotypes. He founded SOLFA (Solve and Flourish Africa), an organization dedicated to empowering marginalized communities through sustainable agricultural practices. His exceptional work and leadership have earned him acceptance as an Anzisha Fellow in 2024.

Fabris's talents are not limited to academics and sustainability; he is also a gifted sculptor and performer, with skills in singing and theater. His diverse abilities and unwavering motivation make him a remarkable young leader. We eagerly anticipate the positive impact Fabris will continue to make in fostering our relationships with the African continent.


treasure in the heart of our GALESS activities in the first place. We take our hat off
